Charles H. Norchi is the Benjamin Thompson Professor of Law in the University of Maine School of Law and Fulbright-Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Iceland) Arctic Scholar. At Maine Law he directs the Center for Oceans & Coastal Law, the Graduate Law Programs and teaches International Law, Law of the Sea, International Human Rights and Maritime Law. His current research includes jurisprudence, polar law, policy sciences and international corporate governance.

Professor Norchi has served as Visiting Professor at City University of Hong Kong School of Law, Peking University School of Law, as Human Rights Fellow at Harvard Law School, Research Fellow in the Center for Public Leadership in the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, Myres S. McDougal Fellow in Yale Law School, Chair of the Admiralty and Maritime Law Section of the American Association of Law Schools. He is co-chair of the Arctic Futures Institute (Maine), the Institute for Law & Development Policy (Geneva, Switzerland) and serves on the Boards of the World Affairs Council of Maine, the Harvard Club in Maine, the Policy Sciences Center, Inc., is a member of the Institute of Directors (London, UK) a contributing Editor to *Global Geneva*, a Fellow of the Explorers Club and Cooperating Professor in the Climate Change Institute of the University of Maine. Dr. Norchi holds an A.B. from Harvard College, a J.D. from Case Western Reserve University Law School and an LL.M. and a J.S.D. from Yale Law School.
